

Foresters Falls, Ont. September 6th 1961  
 Ross Municipal Council met on above date with all members present.

The minutes of last meeting were read and adopted by council and the correspondence and accounts were read and considered.

It was moved by St. Pilgrim, seconded by Geo. Olmstead that Robert Church be appointed fireman to replace Pat Gallagher. The firemen for Halcy now stand as follows:- Deputy Fire Chief, Allan Gilmour, Volunteer Fire Fighters:- Pat Comerford, Harold Gilmour, William Church, Clifford M<sup>c</sup>Laughlin, Selbert Rose, George Bowes and Robert Church.

A delegation <sup>from the Quebec Line Institute</sup> appeared before council in regard to purchasing the former Holiness Movement Church for a community centre and requested council to accept the ownership of same in order to qualify for the Provincial grant in this connection.

Complying with the above request it was moved by R. Oates and seconded by St. Pilgrim that council accept the ownership of the above church and that a by-law <sup>be passed</sup> for that purpose and also for the purpose of appointing a board of management to consist of seven members, two of whom would be appointed from members of the council. Appointed from the council were Paulsen Oates and Harvey Pilgrim. Appointments from the institute members were as follows:- Mrs. S. R. Johnston, Mrs. Ken. M<sup>c</sup>Laughlin, Mrs. Dalton M<sup>c</sup>Phady, Mrs. Harold Hawthorn & Mrs. Ken. Eckford.

Moved by Wm. Stone, seconded by Geo. Olmstead that council grant permission to the St. C. Shaw Company for Ottawa Gas to burn refuse from Cobden to Halcy occasioned by the laying of the gas pipe line through that section with a limit of two weeks to complete the burning of the refuse. Also the Shaw Company to be responsible for any fire getting out of control etc.

Moved by Geo. Olmstead, seconded by Wm. Stone that we accept and pay Road Voucher No. 8 for the month of August 1961 in the amount of \$4,219.86.
