

Forsters Falls, Ont. April 19th 1965

A special meeting of council was held on above date with all members present to discuss the purchase price of property owned by Mrs. Dorothy Gravelle as proposed site for council chambers proposed to be built under the Centennial Grants Programme and to discuss the calling of tenders for gravel, wire, steel posts and culverts required by the township for 1965.

It was moved by Wm. Stone, seconded by H. Pilgrim that council purchase the two village lots in Forsters Falls<sup>lot</sup> No. 15 on John Street and lot 29 on Queen Street owned by Mrs. Dorothy Gravelle at a price of \$600.00 for the purpose of erecting a proposed Municipal Office under the Centennial Grants Programme.

Moved Alden May, seconded by H. Pilgrim that council call for the supplying, crushing, spreading and stockpiling of gravel on township roads, 8,000 tons on roads and 1,000 tons stockpiling for maintenance and 5,000 tons for construction, gravel to pass through  $\frac{3}{8}$  in. screen, to be at least 50% stone and contractor to clear pit. Also that council call for tenders for the requirements of the township for wire, steel posts and culverts required by the Township for 1965 to be supplied as needed.

Ross Municipal Council met on above date with all members present.

The minutes of last two meetings were read and adopted.

Tenders were received for the supplying of fencing material, culverts and hauling and crushing gravel for the current year.

It was moved by Wm. Stone, seconded by H. Pilgrim that council accept the tender of Stafford M. Millar to supply the necessary culverts for the Township for 1965.

Moved by H. Pilgrim, seconded by Geo. Almstead that council accept the tender of Raymond Bell for the supplying of the necessary fencing material for 1965. Fencing at \$1.22 per rod and 7 ft. steel posts at 95¢ each.

Moved by Geo. Almstead, seconded by Alden May that council accept the tender of Mr. Herbert Bauman for supplying, crushing and hauling gravel crushed to  $\frac{5}{8}$ " and spread on Township roads at a price of 87¢ per ton. Stockpiling of same at a price of 87¢ per ton, subject to the approval of the Department of Highways.
