It was moved by H. Pilgrim, seconded by G. Olmstead that council raise the salary of Mrs. D. N. Bell, Librarian, for rent and wages from Eighty Four Dollars per year to One Hundred and Twenty Dollars per year

Moved by Clarence Bilson, seconded by Leo Rathwell that council pay Mrs. Allan Cole the sum of \$200.00 salary for her duties as Acting-Clerk for the Township during Mr. H. Pass' absence through illness.

Moved by H. Pilgrim, seconded by Geo. Olmstead that council call for sealed tenders to be received by the undersigned until 1.00 p.m. Wednesday April 5th 1967 for supplying, crushing, hauling and spreading 10,000 tons of gravel crushed to $\frac{5}{8}$ " for Township roads. Job to be finished by July 1st 1967, and an additional 8,000 tons of gravel crushed to $\frac{5}{8}$ " for construction roads at a later date to be hauled and spread. Also a pile on stockpiling. All work to be under the supervision of the Road Superintendent.

Moved by H. Pilgrim, seconded by Geo. Olmstead that the Council of the Township of Pass make application to the Department of Highways, to have the existing township road, starting from lot 21, concession 8, continuing through lots 22, 23, 24, 25, 26 and 27, concession 8 designated as a Development Road. It is expected there will be considerably heavier traffic due to the new pulp mill on the Zurbie side now under construction. Also due to the fact that the former County Road No. 4 has been taken over by the Department and also to connect up with the new bridge now being constructed.

Moved by H. Pilgrim, seconded by Geo. Olmstead that Council appoint Mr. Arthur Somerville as Cattle Spraying Inspector for warble fly control at a wage of \$1.75 per hour.

Ten thousand tons to be completed by July 1st, 1967 and remainder at a later date at the discretion of the Road Superintendent.
