A special meeting was called on this date for the purpose of considering the following matters:- a by-law to prohibit the use of trailers for living, sleeping and eating accommodations, etc., a by-law to license trailers, a by-law appointing a Building Inspector, to consider tenders received for a sand and salt spreader and to consider the terms required for use of township forestry pump for pumping out basements, etc.

Moved by H. Pilgrim, seconded by Geo. Almstead to introduce a by-law to prohibit the use of trailers for living, sleeping or eating accommodation of persons within the Township of Ross for more than sixty days in any period of ten consecutive months except in a licensed trailer camp. By-law was given first reading on this date.



November 8th 1967 meeting (Continued)

Moved by H. Pilgrim, seconded by Geo. Almstead that council give second and third reading and pass by-law for the purpose of prohibiting the use of trailers for living, sleeping or eating accommodation of persons within the Township for more than sixty days in any period of ten consecutive months.

On motion of Clarence Bilson, seconded by Leo Rathwell a by-law was introduced to license trailers, except trailers in a trailer camp, and for prohibiting such trailers being located in the Municipality, except in a trailer camp, without a license therefor.

Moved by Clarence Bilson, seconded by Leo Rathwell that council give second and third reading and pass by-law for the purpose of licensing trailers, except trailers in a trailer camp, and for prohibiting such trailers being located in the Municipality, except in a trailer camp, without a license.

Moved by Geo. Almstead seconded by H. Pilgrim to ~~introduce~~ <sup>further consider</sup> by-law for the purpose of appointing a Building Inspector and that Stewart Bingham <sup>be appointed as Building Inspector</sup> to enforce building by-law No. 905 at an hourly rate of pay of \$3.00 per hr., plus 10 cents per mile for mileage while performing his duties as Building Inspector.

Moved by Geo. Almstead, seconded by H. Pilgrim that above by-law appointing Building Inspector be given second and third readings and passed this 8th day of November, 1967.

It was moved by Geo. Almstead, seconded by H. Pilgrim that council accept the tender of Bramford Trailer & Body, Ltd. to supply a sand and salt spreader at their tender price of \$2,596.31, plus \$87.25 for blue revolving flasker, a total of \$2,683.56, subject to the approval of the Department of Highways. A tender was also received from King-Seagrave, Ltd. at a price of \$2,623.95 but owing to the proximity of the former Company for repairs, etc the tender was given the former Company.

Moved by Clarence Bilson, seconded by Leo Rathwell that council pass a motion re: the use of forestry pumper for pumping out basements or any other use exclusive of fire-fighting duties and the rate set as follows: - A fee of \$20.00 shall be paid to the Clerk of the Township and this fee shall include the use of pump for a maximum of two hours and the Operator's wages, who must be a township fireman. Permission for use of forestry pump must first be obtained from the Fire Chief or Deputy Fire Chief.
