Moved by Clarence Bileon, seconded by Leo Rathwell that Council become the purchaser of properties on the tax sale for 1969 that do not bring the full amount of the taxes and costs of same.

It was decided to establish a Collection Depot for unused supplies of D.D.T. as requested by the County Health Unit. For this purpose it was decided to use the Municipal Hall at Forsters Falls for a Collection Unit and that February 18th and 19th, 1970 between the hours of 9.00 A.M. and 6.00 P.M. it be made available for same.
