Ross Municipal Council met in their regular monthly meeting on above date with all members present.

The minutes of former minutes were read and adopted.

Moved by Geo. Olmstead, seconded by H. Pilgrim that owing to the difficulty in obtaining the necessary information to make up the budget a by-law was introduced to provide that we issue an interim tax bill at the present time for part taxes and the taxes on this bill would be due on July 15th, 1971 and interest is added ^{at the rate of 1% per month} after July 15th, 1971 to the end of the year if unpaid. A further tax bill will be issued ^{later} showing the balance due and this second payment will be due December 20th, 1971 and 1 per cent interest is added on this payment, if unpaid, from December 20th, 1971 to December 31st, 1971.
