

Foresters Falls, Ont. April 5th 1972

Ross Municipal Council met on above date in their regular monthly meeting and all members were present.

The minutes of former meetings were read and adopted.

It was moved by Clarence Bilson, seconded by Leo Rathwell that Council accept the tender of Lakewood Milling, Ltd. of Cobden for the following fencing materials: - 8-42 fencing per rod \$1.69, 16 ft. wire gates \$30.95 each, 7 ft T Bar posts with clips \$1.42, without clips \$1.39, No. 9 galvanized brace wire 50 lbs \$8.15, $1\frac{3}{4}$ x 9 staples per 50 lbs \$8.45.

Moved by George Olmstead, seconded by St. Pilgrin that Council accept the tender of Herbert E. Brumm for the supplying crushing, hauling and spreading on Township roads approximately 7,000 tons of gravel to pass through a $\frac{5}{8}$ " screen on or before June 15th 1972 at \$1.54 per ton and the same amount at a later date at \$1.54 per ton. Also 1000 tons of $\frac{3}{8}$ " crushed gravel off belt at .85 \$ per ton, subject to the approval of the Dept. of Transportation & Communications and work to be done under the supervision of the Road Superintendent.

Moved by St. Pilgrin, seconded by George Olmstead that Council purchase 550 lbs. of Sic White from Texas Refinery Corp. of Canada, Ltd at a price of Two Hundred and Eighty Five Dollars and sixty seven cents.

Moved by Clarence Bilson, seconded by Leo Rathwell that Council authorize the person or persons making the enumeration of the population census in the Township for the year 1972 to: -

(1) Register the dogs of the property owners in the Township for which the Enumerator shall receive a fee from the Municipality of 20 cents per dog.

(2) Collect the dog tax, if possible, for the tenants dogs in the Township and the Enumerator shall receive 50 cents for each tenant dog tax collected.

The dog tax for a male dog or spayed female shall be \$2.00.

The dog tax for a female dog shall be \$4.00

A charge of \$4.00 dog tax shall be imposed on each additional dog after the first.

Moved by Leo Rathwell, seconded by Clarence Bilson that Council approve the payment of Road Voucher No. 3 for the month of March in the amount of \$5,665.58.
