A special meeting was held on April 5, 1973 to finish up the business left over from the regular monthly meeting of April 4, 1973 with all members present.

It was moved by Leo Rathwell, seconded by J. Bell that Council approve the petition of Haley area residents to the Dept. of Transportation and Communications to have the speed limit reduced on Highway 17 in Haley Station (as received at the April 4, 1973 meeting). Council requested the Clerk to write the Dept. of Transportation and Communications, Ottawa; and Mr. Maurice Hamilton - Parliament Bldg., Toronto - - stating that Council has approved it.

Alden May requested we purchase a new flag, to replace the one that was taken from the flag-pole last Halloween night, and all members of Council were in favour.

Council requested the Clerk to write Mr. Barry O'Gorman, Clerk Treasurer, Colden to find out ^{what} effluent discharge from the Quersil Plant is emptying into the creek that runs through property owned by Graham McLeod and Ivan McMillan; as to its harmful effects if any on land, crops, livestock and humans?

Forester's Falls

April 18, 1973.

A special meeting was held on April 18, 1973 at 7:30 P.M. in the administration building to meet with Mr. Don Simpson, Real Estate Agent, from Pembroke. A discussion was held on the proposed sale of Chromasco Townsite and Mr. Simpson's proposal for the Municipality to take over (within the townsite boundaries) both the well and lake-water systems.

Mr. Simpson stated that it was estimated that it would cost the buyer \$100,000.00 to bring the 32 townsite houses up to acceptable standards. This included a new septic system, improving the water systems where necessary, painting the houses, and doing something to ~~the~~ make sure that there will be no more wet basements, etc.

Council suggested that shut-off valves would have to be installed on all water lines leading to the townsites from Chromasco and outside each home. The water lines should all be pressure tested and possibly all new lines installed in the old townsite.

Mr. Simpson stated that the houses ^{and land} would be divided up and surveyed into lots; and all road allowances are to be 66 feet. All conditions would have to meet the specifications of the OWRC and DCP.

The above is only a proposal which was presented by Mr. Don Simpson and discussed with council.
