- Any maintenance be charged back to the householders
- A consulting engineer should be requested at no charge to town.
- Engineer should advise - How to go about maintenance? Life expectancy of existing situation? Annual cost of up-keep?
- Developer must come up with an agreement.

It was decided to ask Jim Stephens to stay at least until the end of the week, June 15. Mr. Herb Ross was asked to assist the clerk-treasurer but salary was not set.

General Purpose - Residential 24.0

Commercial 29.3

High School - Residential 24.7

Commercial 27.5

Public School - Residential 27.6

Commercial 30.6

County Rate 11.4

Street Lights 3.5

Allan Cole presented the road budget for 1973 which had a total of \$21,727.27.

After a discussion on the townsite it was decided to wait until Bob Durr had sent his recommendations before going to talk to Mr. Simpson.

The regular meeting of the Ross Municipal Council was held on July 4, 1973 with all members present.

The minutes of the June meetings were read and adopted.

It was moved by Ray Bennett and seconded by Barrie Ross that council pay Clarkson & Gordon and Co., chartered accountants. Audit fee \$2000, Special work \$400, out of pocket disbursements \$220. Total of \$2620 for the year 1972.

It was moved by Barrie Ross seconded by Ray Bennett that taxes shall become due and payable on the 1st day of August 1973 but may be paid in two instalments on the 1st day of August 1973 and the 20th day of December 1973. Interest on tax arrears to be calculated to July 31st after that date 1% per month is added.

It was moved by Ray Bennett seconded by Barrie Ross that council pay road vouchers no 6 in the amount of \$6,753.48 for the month of June. Clarence Colford presented a petition for a municipal drain known as the 5th Line Drain.
