Council suggested that the Trailer Camps be notified that the yearly fees are going to raised next year.

Council suggested that the Ministry of Transportation and Communications be reminded that the speed limit signs at Halcy have not been changed.

Moved by Jack Bell seconded by Leo Rathwell that council engage Jim Seabie to cut the grass at the Forester's Falls Hall and Library at a wage of \$40.00 for the year 1974.
