It was the understanding of council that Mr. Healey would pay the Hydro for the remainder of ^{the year} 1974.

On a request from council Alder May and Allan Cole were instructed to investigate a fence which was erected across an access road ^{which} for cottage owners used near the Robert Church gravel pit.

Council gave consent to Robert Ford to use a Township road for a horse drawn stagecoach.

Council were in agreement to have the engineers for the 5th Line Municipal Drain put the ditch further onto the road allowances.
