The regular meeting of the Ross Municipal Council was held on May 5th, 1976 in the Council Chambers with all members present.

The minutes of the April meetings were read and adopted by council and the bills were presented.

A letter was received from a ratepayer concerning the removal of a beam from the 5th Line Municipal Drain. After some discussion it was decided to get legal advice.

It was moved by Ray Bennett seconded by Alvin Stone that council pay road vouchers #4 in the amount of \$6830.87 for the month of April 1976.

It was moved by John Bell seconded by Barrie Ross that council accept the tender of Hoffman Concrete Products Ltd of Pembroke, Ont to crush, spread and stockpile, Granular A to pass through a $\frac{5}{8}$ " screen.

Spread on road 8000 Tons @ \$1.78 per ton

Off Belt 2000 Tons @ \$1.39 per ton

Work will commence by June 15/76. Subject to the approval of the Ministry of Transportation & Communications Tele Drain loans to ratepayers in 1976 will be that first applications be accepted to the amount \$12,900.

First Instalment due June 30th, 1976.

Second Instalment due October 30th, 1976.

There shall be 3% discount on the second instalment paid on or before June 30th, 1976.

Taxes shall be payable at the Ross Municipal Office or for a 25¢ charge at the Bank of Nova Scotia, Cobden.

It was moved by Ray Bennett seconded by Alvin Stone that council give a grant of \$75.00 to the North Kenton Agricultural Society for the purpose of assisting with their annual fall fair.

It was moved by Alvin Stone seconded by Ray Bennett that council enter into agreement with the Village of Cobden to share in the operation costs of a Planimeter for the Township of Ross and the Village of Cobden. The Planimeter to be erected in the Provincial Park in Cobden, subject to the consent of the Village of Cobden.
