A Special Committee meeting of Council was called on March 3, 1997 at 1:30 p.m. in the Council Chambers, to discuss three issues with County Engineer, Ken Becking.

Present were Reeve Alvin Stone, Deputy-Reeve Jack Ferguson, Councillors Don Rathwell, Victor McLaughlin and Bill Gibson, and Road Superintendent Felix Rathwell.

Mr. Becking showed drawings of the proposal for County Road 21 at the Beachburg-Forester's Falls corner with the through road from Cobden to Forester's Falls and a turning lane to Beachburg, and a merging lane from Beachburg.

A proposed addition at Haley Industries makes it necessary to relocate their entrance on County Road 7. Their parking lot is being moved to the East side of the Fifth on County Road 7. Their parking lot is being moved to the East side of the Fifth Concession (Blind Line), and the Township need to insure that there is proper drainage and possibly ask Haley Industries to upgrade the road where employees will be crossing.
