The Council of the Corporation of the Village of Beaching met on the above date at the Municipal office.

Present were Reeve T. S. Harris and councillors Mrs Jean Rollens, W. A. Bennett, B. G. Ross, and Arthur Luce.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Correspondence read and discussed.

Rev. Roberts and Rufed Bennett came to council to ask that assistance be given to Mrs John Lacey in seeking social welfare. The council was to check on the hospitalization coverage for Mrs Lacey. Mr. Carl Dunn, E. C. B. Foster and Mr. H. G. Maclellan representatives from the Beaching Lions Club met with Council to discuss the entering of the municipality of Beaching into membership with the E. O. D. A (Eastern Ontario Development Association). It was deemed advisable by Council to leave this decision until after a speaker from E. O. D. A could be heard at a May meeting of the Lions Club.

Mr. Jack Johnson representative from Beaching to the Pembroke & District High School Board upon request from Council attended the meeting and answered questions relating to the building & financing of the new Vocational and commercial school being built in Pembroke beginning this year.

Mr. Herbert Ross assessor met with Council upon their request to discuss questions relating to this years assessment roll. Mr. Ross was asked to ~~have~~ ^{obtain} the assistance of Mr. Fred O'Dell county assessor if necessary to have certain additions made to the roll.

The clerk was asked to answer the letter from the Township of Westmeath dated Mar 14/61 ^{to say} that there would be no charge from the Beaching Fire Brigade in connection with answering the call in question.

Moved by Mrs Jean Collins and Arthur Griese that the sum of (\$50.⁰⁰) fifty dollars be given as a donation toward the Beaulieu Fall Fair and paid to the North West Agricultural Society. Carried.

Moved by J.A. Burnett and B. J. Ross that this council accept their responsibility in connection with the building and maintenance of the Pembroke Vocational and Commercial school. Carried.

Moved by B. J. Ross and J.A. Burnett that this council support the application of the Canadian National Railway for extension of P.C.V. class "D" license privileges to cover the carriage of express to and from Beaulieu as a public necessity and that Rene T.S. Harris be authorized to represent the municipality at said hearing. Carried.
