To Assess

Levy

Moved by B. J. Ross and Arthur Thiese that the By-Law to assess and levy rates and taxes for County Village streets, Street lights, schools, grants and all purposes for the Village of Beachburg 1961 have the blanks filled in as follows:

- (1) That the sum of (\$4730.75) is hereby levied upon and shall be collected from all rateable property within the Village of Beachburg for County purposes for the year 1961 at a rate of (13.5) mills on the dollar
- (2) That the sum of (\$4091.24) is hereby levied upon and shall be collected from all rateable property within the Village of Beachburg for the purpose of Pembroke and District High School Bond for the year 1961 at a rate of (11.7) mills on the dollar
- (3) That the sum of (\$9337.50) is hereby levied upon and shall be collected from all rateable property within the area known as Beachburg Waterworks Area, for the purpose of Beachburg Waterworks Detention, for the year 1961, at a rate of (28.7) mills on the dollar
- (4) That the sum of (\$2460.16) is hereby levied upon and shall be collected from all rateable property within the Village of Beachburg for General Purposes for the year 1961, at a rate of (11) mills on the dollar Commercial and at a rate of (6) mills on the dollar residential
- (5) That the sum of (\$671.42) is hereby levied upon and shall be collected from all rateable property within an area known as Beachburg Lighting Area for the purpose of street lighting

for the year 1961, at a rate of (2) mills on the dollar.

(6) and be it further enacted that the following rate on the dollar shall be levied upon and collected from all rateable property within the Village of Beachburg for Trustee levy of (\$6472.00) for Public School Section No 7 for the year 1961 at (18.5) mills.

3. "Every application for water from the Waterworks System shall be made at the Clerk's Office upon the form provided for the purpose, and such application shall be basis of the contract between the applicant and the Village for the supply of such water."

48. Every person who commits a breach of any provision of this By-Law shall incur a penalty not exceeding \$20.00 for each offence or may be imprisoned instead the option of a fine for any period not exceeding one month.

49 and all applications for adjustments of accounts shall be made at the Clerk-Treasurer's office."
