BY-LAW NO _____

A BY-LAW TO AMEND THE WATERWORKS BY-LAW OF THE CORPORATION OF THE VILLAGE OF BEACHBURG.

Whereas it is necessary to provide by by-law to amend The Waterworks By-law of the Corporation of the Village of Beachburg, also known as By-Law No 819 of the Twp. of Westmeath dated August 5th 1955, and adopted by the Village of Beachburg upon it's incorporation January 1st 1959;

And whereas the council of the village of Beachburg deems it necessary to change schedule "A" of the Rates Part 4 of said by-law;

Therefore the council of the Corporation of the Village of Beachburg hereby amends schedule "A" of said by-law and declare that it shall read as follows:

REVISED SCHEDULE "A" OF WATER RATES FOR THE BEACHBURG WATERWORKS AREA

Private Dwellings & Apartments

One in private dwelling ----- \$8.50
Each additional in private dwelling or apt. ----- \$1.00

One in private house, apartment or other place --- \$3.00
Each additional in private house or apt. ----- \$2.00

Any person obtaining water from the Beachburg Waterworks System and not liable to rates as otherwise herein mentioned must pay two dollars (\$2.00) for every 500 gallons of water received.

The plant of The Ottawa Valley Grain Products Limited is liable to an annual charge of \$100.00 (one hundred dollars) for it's water service.

The Twp. of Westmeath is liable to an annual charge of \$50.00 for their water service to the Twp. Hall located within the Village of Beachburg.

Second 50,000 gallons -----60¢ per 1000 gals.

Next 200,000 gallons -----50¢ per 1000 gals.

All in excess of 300,000 gallons -----40¢ per 1000 gals.

Minimum charge -----\$5.00

Apartment Block Services: In the case of an Apartment Block of Tenement having one or more service connections, the owner shall pay or responsible for payment of all water supplied to the property, but where any suite has a separate service it may be rated as a separate house and the owner may direct that the account be forwarded to the occupant. The owner however, shall remain responsible for payment of all accounts.
