Meeting was called to order by Rouse T. S. Harris at 7 p.m.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Correspondence presented.

① From Laurentian Tissue & Paper Institute a thank you for the use of the fire hall July 30th 1966.

② From Bank of Nova Scotia notice that collection costs will be increased from 10¢ to 15¢ per account.

③ From Memorial Bronze - give list Re: centennial of confederation permanent markers.

Mr. Arthur Cairns, representing the Beaulieu Canada Centennial committee attended council to ask permission for the committee to use the municipal garage for displays during the centennial year.

Moved by Alfred H. Campbell and R. V. Daugherty that the Council of the Village of Beaulieu approve to give the garage side of the football for storage and display purposes of the Centennial committee. Carried.

Mr. Cairns' request on behalf of the centennial committee for decorative street lighting during centennial year is delayed for further study.

Alfred H. Campbell gave notice of a by-law to assess and levy rates and taxes for county purposes, village streets, street lights, schools and all other purposes for the village for the year 1966.

Moved by R. V. Daugherty & Alfred H. Campbell that the by-law to levy rates for the village of Beaulieu for the year 1966 be now introduced and read a first time.

Moved by R. V. Daugherty and Alfred H. Campbell that the by-law to assess and levy rates for 1966 have the blanks filled

- ① in as follows; that the sum of (\$6,008.06) is hereby levied upon and shall be collected from all rateable property within the Village of Beaulieu for the purpose of Beaulieu for the year 1966 at the rate of (15.2) mills on the dollar.
- ② that the sum of (\$7,999.38) is hereby levied upon and shall be collected from all rateable property within the village of Beaulieu for the purpose of providing \$3,784.33 for the Pembroke Collegiate Institute and \$3,799.33 for Champlain Secondary School and \$415.67 to the town of Pembroke as new high school debenture debt at the rate of (19.5) mills on the dollar commercial and (17.6) mills on the dollar residential.
- ③ that the sum of (\$9,975.00) is hereby levied upon and shall be collected from all rateable property within the area known as the Beaulieu Waterworks Area for the purpose of the Beaulieu Waterworks Debenture for the year 1966 at the rate of (25.5) mills on the dollar.
- ④ that the sum of (\$6,364.00) is hereby levied upon and shall be collected from all rateable property within the Village of Beaulieu for general purposes for the year 1966 at the rate of (21.3) mills on the dollar commercial and (14.9) mills on the dollar residential.
- ⑤ that the sum of (\$1,490.58) is hereby levied upon and shall be collected from all rateable property within the area known as the Beaulieu Lighting Area for the purpose of street lighting for the year 1966 at the rate of (4) mills on the dollar.
- ⑥ and further be it enacted that the following sum of (\$5,839.70) shall be levied upon all rateable property within the village of Beaulieu to provide trustee bonds of (\$5,619.94) to the Trustee & Stafford

T. S. A. Board and \$ 219.76 to the Schellart School for Retarded Children at the rate of (16) mills on the dollar commercial and (14.4) mills on the dollar residential. Passed in open council this 3rd day of August 1966 Carried.
