The Council of the Corporation of the Village of ϑ eachburg met on the above date at the Municipal Office at a Special Meeting.

Reeve Jamieson called the meeting to order at 8:30 p.m., with everyone present.

Moved by Grant Somerville and seconded by Jim Labow that the Council of the Corporation of the Village of Beachburg hereby agrees to tolerate the setback of a new house constructed on Lot 17, Plan 444, in the Village of Beachburg, of 24 feet from Harris Crescent. Carried.

Moved by Beulah Wright and seconded by Grant Somerville that a by-law to adopt the estimates and set the mill rates for 1994 be received and read afirst time. Carried.

Moved by Jacob DeWal and seconded by Jim Labow that a by-law to adopt the estimates and set the mill rates be read a second time and be referred to a committee of the whole Council. Carried.

Moved by Graat Somerville and seconded by Beulah Wright that a by-law to adopt the estimates and set the mill rates for 1994 as reported by the Committee of the Whole be read a third time, passed and numbered 664 and that the said by-law be engrossed in the By-Law Book. Carried.

The situation of flooding on Harris Crescent was discussed and it was decided to try to get proper dry wells installed, or drainage of some sort.

Reeve Jamieson stated that Craig Werle wanted to buy a lot from the Village, up behind the Medical Centre. It was agreed to ask \$5,000.00 for the lot.
