- 2. From David J. Norlock of M.T.O., a letter re the inspection of Vera Crescent and the severe Roadway Frost Heaves.
- 3. From Laidlaw Waste Systems, a letter stating that surcharge will be increased by 1.5% (.32¢)
- 4. From the Playground Committee of Beachburg Public School, notice that a Country Day to raise funds for playground equipment would be held on May 25, 1996 at the Fair Grounds.
- 5. From the County of Renfrew, a letter regarding the County continuing to licence auctioneers.

He then left, after asking Council to consider fencing the sides of the tennis courts.

Moved by Ron Lowe and seconded by Jim Labow that a by-law to adopt the estimates and t strike the mill rates for 1996 as reported by the Committee of the Whole be read a third time, passed and numbered 688 and that the said by-law be signed by the Reeve and clerk, sealed with the seal of the Corporation, and be engrossed in the By-Law Book. Carried.

Moved by Ron Lowe and seconded by Jim Labow that a By-law to borrow money from the Bank of Nova Scotia be read a first time. Carried.

Moved by Beulah Wright and seconded by Ron Lowe that a by-law to borrow money from the Bank of Nova Scotia be read a second time and be referred to a committee of the whole Council. Carried.

Moved by Beulah Wright and seconded by Grant Somerville that a by-law to borrow money from the Bank of Nova Scotia for operating purposes during the year 1996 as reported by the Committee of the Whole be read a third time, passed and numbered 689 and that the said by-law be signed by the Reeve and clerk, sealed with the seal of the Corporation, and be engross in the By-Law Book. Councillor Labow also stated that some sort of retaining wall was required along Morris Street, in front of Mrs. White's residence.

Councillor Somerville stated that he thought the sludge from the water plant could be disposed of at the Municipal Garage. He also stated that Council should be looking for a loader of some sort.
