

Coalden May 3/97

Regular meeting of Council held on the above date in Memorial Hall. All present

Minutes of last meeting were read, approved, and signed by the Reeve.

Messrs Hawkins & Dunlop were at the meeting asking for cooperation and assistance for a Coronation day celebration. Moved by Mr Collins Sec Mr Morris that the scouts be permitted to have a beacon fire in the Parks - and a donation of £100 towards fireworks <sup>also to plant a flag (at and near) on these grounds.</sup> Carried.

Messrs Ritchie, Duck & Ross were present to ask Council to take some steps to improve the appearance of the back parts of the Boy's Block property.

Mr L. Sturt was present to report on the Hall roof.

The Mrs. Ritchie, Hill & Duck were present representing the Horticultural Society to ask assistance <sup>and permission</sup> in improving the parks. Any action by Council will be considered later.

The rent of the village property occupied by Mrs Palmer was set at 5<sup>00</sup> per month a new door for the Linthouse at no more than 2<sup>00</sup> was authorized.

Moved by Mr Wilson Sec Mr Lalonde that the rental price for use of the grade outside of the municipality be £2<sup>00</sup> per day or part of day. Carried. The clerk was instructed to have H.B. J. write the Hamiltonian Electors.

Re summing the P.P. machinery

Mr Wilson Sec Mr Morris that Messrs Ross & Lalonde be a Committee to investigate conditions at back of Boy's Block. Carried

Moved by Mr Collins Sec Mr Morris that a warning be published in the Sun. against depositing on the streets any rubbish, tree cuttings or anything that should not be, and that all unsanitary and fire dangerous rubbish in private yards must be cleaned up by May 15<sup>th</sup>/97. Violations of the above will be lawfully penalized. Carried.

Moved by Mr Wilson Sec Mr Lalonde that Bylaw for payments be read a few times and the Bylaw was read accordingly.

Moved by Mr Morris Sec Mr Collins that Bylaw No 593 for payments be read having been filled in heretofore a second and this time read and passed.

Council adjourned.
