 Emergency meeting held in Fire hall
 at call of Reeve to meet with Committee
 and discuss gift to service men - problems.
 Present: Reeve, Collins, Councilman, Dack,
 MacKercher, Lertz and Mackley, Mr. Furlong
 and Dr. Kitcher who with Mr Collins and
 Dr MacKercher compose gift fund Committee.
 Mr Bayle was present and showed
 several of the watches ready for presentation.
 It was agreed that Mr Bayle be paid
 fifty dollars for each watch and fifteen
 dollars for each ring on delivery of
 same. Mr Bayle is presenting a plaque
 to honor engraver thereon to Governor.
 Clerk reported that to date Fund
 consists of \$1250. raised by levy and
 \$1234 raised by donation.

Council agreed that this money be
 placed in a separate account and
 administered therefrom. That watches
 on hand be placed in Bank for safekeeping
 on Wednesday June 5/46. was set as day
 upon which field day and presentations
