Mr. H. W. Hawkins, Mr. J. W. Johnson and Mr. J. W. Sinn - representing the Cobden Amusement Co. appeared before Council asking a reduction in rent for coming year. Mr. Hawkins quoted some rates of charges for similar halls in other places. Previous rate was 75¢ per night and after some discussion the following motion was passed:

" The Council of the Municipality of the Village of Cobden hereby agrees that for the sum of 24⁰⁰ the Cobden Jr. Farmers organization and the Cobden Jr. Institute may have the use of the Menard Hall for twelve regular meetings, the two organizations to meet on same evening. These meetings are to be held between dates of Feb. 1/47 and Jan 31/48.

The meetings are to be held in the basement of the Hall with the exception of one for which if so desired the organization may use the upstairs or auditorium part of the hall.

The attendance of the meetings will be composed of regular members of the organization and any guests they care to invite.

Two of the meetings may be open to public. The meetings will be held in the form of a business meeting followed by a program and/or a social time and/or moving pictures.
